## A TIME OF REMEMBRANCE



"The Remembrance Day Ceremony has played a major role in Remembrance since 1931. Every year, at the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month, we gather in memorial parks, community halls, workplaces, schools and homes to stand in honour of all who have fallen. Pandemic restrictions have meant smaller ceremonies, or their outright cancellation. Other gatherings are being replaced with virtual ceremonies. Nevertheless, the tradition of Remembrance will continue, and Canada's Fallen will not be forgotten. The Royal Canadian Legion



encourages all Canadians to observe a moment of silence on November 11, to mark the sacrifice of the many who have fallen in the service of their country, and to acknowledge the courage of those who still serve."

### **TECHNOLOGY AT SCHOOL:**

Mr. Kent is irreplaceable at the school. We are so lucky to have him as part of our Burkevale team! Below is some pertinent information from Mr. Kent that is related to students and technology.

**Google for Education -** Burkevale is once again using Google for Education and is fortunate to have a variety of subscriptions to websites for school and home use. To login to your child's Google for Education account follow the steps in this video link. (**Security note:** If you use the Google Chrome browser at home but do not have a google account linked to it but have added bookmarks to the browser these may sync to your child's account...double check this before linking the account and either delete the bookmarks or create a personal Google Account first).

Once they link to their GSuite school account any bookmarks, usernames and passwords for the programs they use in class should be synchronized. Many teachers will also provide usernames and passwords that may be needed as well via Seesaw, Google Classroom or by physical notes. Our rollable Makerspace carts filled with lots of STEAM activities are up and running and students couldn't be more thrilled. Students can also join our Google Classroom Maker Academy to access videos



and activities of Coding, 3-D Printing, crafts and more. (Note: We are always looking for shoeboxes for our crafting station).

Finally our Grade 4-8 students will once again have the opportunity to use a Fitbit this year to help encourage fitness and well-being throughout the school year. Parents will have to sign the permission slip on School-Day before students can take one home for the year.

## **Grandfather Teachings for the Month of November:**

For the month of November, our school community will be focusing on the grandfather teaching of **TRUTH**. Truth is represented by the turtle as he was here during the creation of Earth and carries the teachings of life on his back. The turtle lives life in a slow and meticulous manner because he

understands the importance of both the journey and the destination.

## Secret Path Week (October 17th-22nd):

Secret Path Week is a national movement commemorating the legacies Chanie Wenjack and Gord Downie. This is a meaningful week as October 17th and 22nd respectively mark the dates that Gord Downie and Chanie Wenjack joined the spirit world. We call on all Canadians to use Secret path Week to answer Gord Downie's call, to "Do Something" by creating reconciliACTION



and furthering the conversation about the history of residential schools.



Walk for Wenjack: Our school participated in Walk for Wenjack during Secret path Week. Our goal was to walk 600km to reach the distance Chanie Wenjack would have had to walk to reach his home. In reality Chanie made it 51 km before the elements were too much for him. This national movement is a reflective time to remember all those children who attended residential schools and honour those who never made it back home.









Railway track sections were added in our hallway to represent 10km walked. Each class added their unique sections to bring Chanie home.





## **Upcoming Days of Significance:**

**Treaties Recognition week (Nov 1st - 7th):** Treaty Education Week is recognized the first full school week of November. This is a recurring opportunity to intentionally deepen our knowledge and understanding of Treaties, Indigenous perspectives, our collective history, and align with #62 & #63 of the Truth and Reconciliation Call to Action.

**National Inuit Day Nov 7th:** A day to honour the vibrant culture and rich history of Inuit communities in Canada and around the world.

**National Aboriginal Veterans Day Nov 8th:** Indigenous people in Canada have reason to be proud of their wartime contributions. More than 7,000 First Nations members served in the First and Second World Wars and the Korean War, and an unknown number of Inuit, Métis and other Indigenous people also participated. One Veterans group estimates that 12,000 Indigenous men and women served in the three wars.

**November 16th: Louis Riel Day**: As stated by former Métis Nation of Ontario President, Tony Belcourt, "November 16th marks a significant occasion of observance for the Métis Nation. This date gives us an opportunity to bring about an enlightened focus on the significant role and achievements of Louis Riel and the Métis Nation in the building of Canada."
